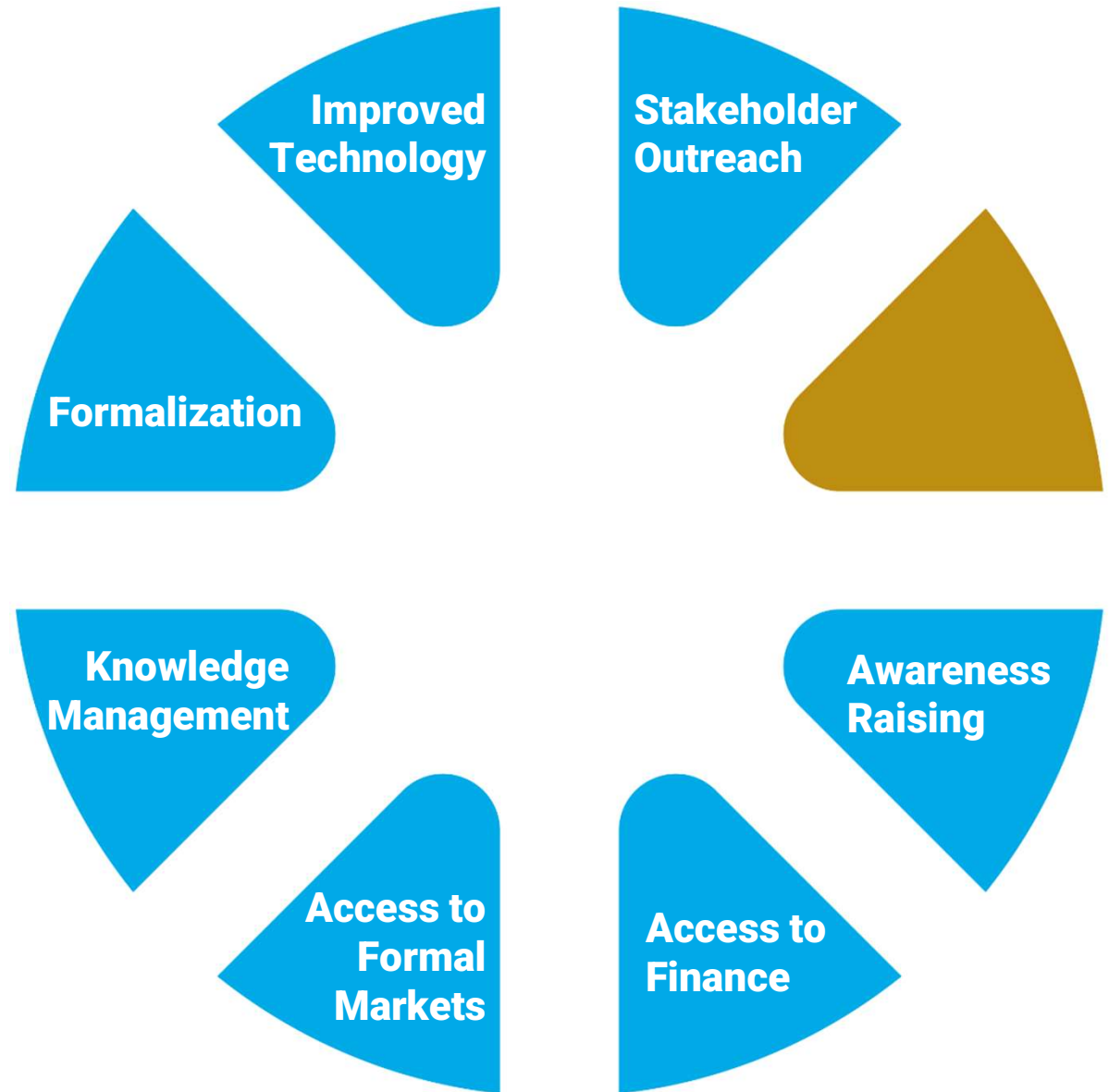

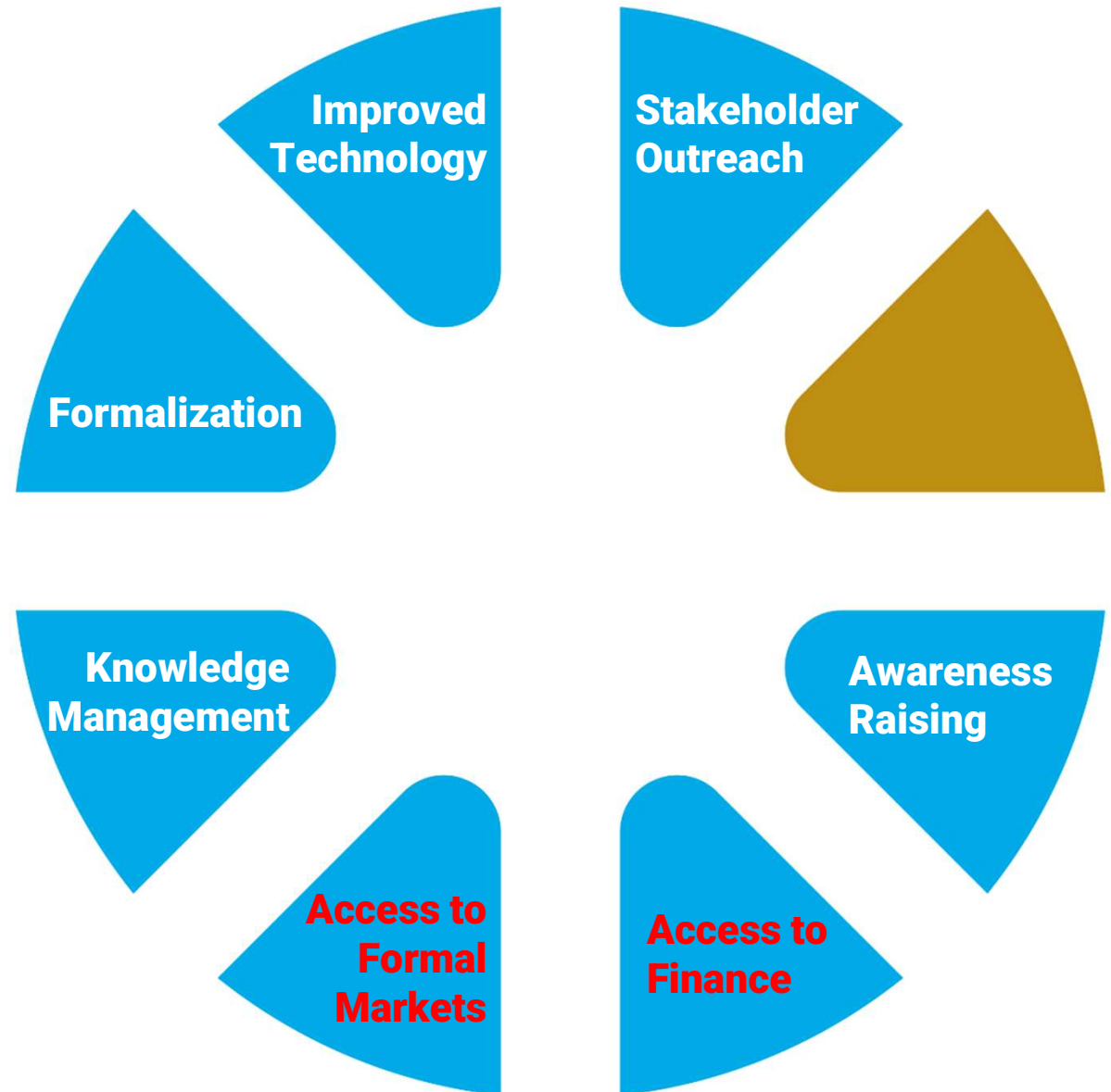

<p>Must be formalized/legitimate or engaged in the process.</p> <p>Eliminates mercury in its production and prevents exposure to its community.</p>	<p>Has policies and practices in place to ensure that the Mining Entity is not involved in any activities that violate human rights.</p> <p>Protects and respects rights of Indigenous Peoples.</p>	<p>Has systems in place to honor and restrict any mining activity in areas that are protected due to their physical cultural importance and tangible cultural heritage.</p> <p>Has procedures in place towards integrating into existing communities.</p>	<p>Supports fair treatment, non-discrimination, equal opportunities.</p> <p>There is NO direct or indirect support of any forced labor, including child labor.</p> <p>Has mechanisms for grievance and conflict resolution systems in place.</p>	<p>Has occupational and community health, and safety policies in place.</p> <p>Has protection and steps in place to protect women and children against sexual violence and harassment.</p>	<p>Has policies and practices in place which minimize impact on biodiversity, Critical Habitats or ecosystem services.</p> <p>Practices pollution prevention.</p>

ISLANDS – Private sector engagement

The ISLANDS programme is focused on developing robust public-private sector partnerships, combined with national level sustainable financial mechanisms

All regions:

Coordination with public and private sectors on the following waste streams:

- Waste from Electrical and Electronic Equipment
- End of Life Vehicles
- Plastics
- Used oil
- Healthcare waste

IDB Child Project in the Caribbean:

- Direct co-financer and implementing agency for one of the Caribbean Child Projects
- Objective: creating sustainable and effective public and private sector investments in chemicals and waste management
