Fostering engagement to initiate economic and industry sector programmes

- To create momentum towards developing industry sector programmes and implementing Target D6, the IOMC and individual POs are in a dialogue with certain economic and industry sectors
- Relevant industry sectors for which the IOMC and its POs already have close contacts include, for example: the Electronics Industry, Healthcare Industry, Textile Industry, Construction Industry, and the Finance and Investment Sector.
- Other sectors for which industry sector implementation programmes could be considered, include, but are not limited to the following sectors: Energy, Food and Agriculture, Household and Personal Care Products, Pharmaceuticals, Retail, Textiles, Tourism, Toys, Transportation, as well as the Chemical Industry and Chemical Distributors.
- Stakeholders from relevant industry sectors who are interested to consider the development of a GFC industry sector-specific implementation programme are encouraged to contact the IOMC.

Preparation of Documents for OEWG in June 2025

- Following the above workshop, IOMC with input from stakeholders, will prepare an Inf document(s) for the OEWG meeting in June 2025
- Include a draft mandate, TOR, and workplan for the programme and summarize relevant activities undertaken to-date and possible next steps between the OEWG and first international conference (late 2026).
- Refinement of draft mandates, TORs, and workplans, 3^{rd/4th} Q 2025 and early 2026

- WHO/Unitaid Expert Consultation: Climate resilient and environmentally sustainable supply chains in the health sector, October 2024
 - Considered the GFC and implementation by the health sector as a value chain
